Subject	2025 Community Climate Action Plan Implementation Report

Summary

Staff is honored to present highlights from the 2025 Community Climate Action Plan (CCAP) Implementation Report. Raleigh’s CCAP Implementation Report is the annual report published by the Office of Sustainability that celebrates the sustainability and climate action initiatives undertaken by our partners across the City and community to make Raleigh a healthier, safer, more accessible, beautiful, cleaner and more resilient community.

Raleigh has three main objectives in implementing high impact climate action:

- Reducing greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs) to meet Raleigh’s community-wide goal of an 80% reduction of GHG emissions by the year 2050
- Building community resilience to the impacts of climate change including flooding and extreme heat, Raleigh’s primary environmental hazards
- Fostering social advancement, community health, affordability, access, and safety across the Raleigh community

The three strategy areas of CCAP are organized to focus on high impact and include: Buildings and Energy, Transportation and Land Use, and Resilience and Cross-Cutting. The cross-cutting strategies of social advancement, innovation, education and outreach and funding for climate action are applied to all areas of our work and can be found throughout the CCAP Implementation Report.

There are hundreds of implementation updates in the 2025 CCAP Implementation Report that showcase the important climate action work happening across the community. The City Council presentation will cover just a few highlights under each of the three strategy areas. These highlights are included below:

Buildings and Energy:
